Congrès du Management de Projets – Lausanne April 2010

“Quick Wins using Virtual Teams” in Basel

Last March in Basel, Dr. Deasún Ó Conchúir led a very interactive session on Virtual Teams at the Roche Learning Center.

There are a lot of different reasons why more and more virtual teams exist. While it has certain benefits for both the companies and employees, it does create challenges if people are not co-located, might not speak the same language and even be in very different time zones.

In the first part of the session, Dr. Ó Conchúir introduced a couple of key factors to create an environment that fosters virtual teams:

- It is important that virtual teams are part of company culture and promoted by management
- The employees have to embrace the concept of virtual teams
- Most importantly, virtual teams need a culture of trust

Dr. Ó Conchúir gave further tips & tricks on implementing the elements above, such as improving listening skills, awareness about differences, sharing the burden of time differences and best practices for virtual meetings. Overall, it takes an extra amount of care to make sure that all team members are in the loop, and sometimes, just a small thing, as adding team member pictures to data conferences, will help to close the geographical gap.

In the second part of the session, participants were filling out in groups a questionnaire about different cultures, which lead to a lot of discussions and surprises. The whole session on virtual teams actually triggered a lot of food for thoughts and ideas and it was an ideal icebreaker for the networking apero following the event.
